# Certificate IV in Mental Health



## About this course?

Our CHC43315 - Certificate IV in Mental Health comprises 15 units (11 core units and 4 elective units) and 80 hours of supervised work placement completed within 12 months.

You will learn the skills and knowledge required to implement community based programs and activities focusing on mental health, mental illness and psychiatric disability.

## Why do our course?

- Our CHC43315 - Certificate IV in Mental Health is designed for people wishing to work in a range of community contexts such as community based non-government organisations; home based outreach; centre-based programs; respite care; residential services, rehabilitation programs; clinical settings; or supporting people in employment.

## Entry Requirements

For students who are eligible to access funding through the Higher Level Skills program, students must be an Existing Worker in the Community Services and Health industry and be able to provide current evidence of this.

Other eligibility requirements are:

- Over the age of 15 and not currently enrolled at secondary school
- Having a current residential address in Queensland
- Be an Australian Citizen, Australian Permanent Resident (including humanitarian entrant), a temporary resident with necessary work and visa permits on the pathway to permanent residency NZ Citizen or
- not hold, and not be enrolled in, a certificate IV or higher-level qualification, not including qualifications completed at school and foundation skills training

## Payment and Funding Options

There are different payment options available depending on your situation.

\*Each student funded under the Higher Level Skills Program is required to pay a co-contribution fee towards their qualification.

The student co-contribution for the CHC43315 – Certificate IV in Mental Health is \$100.00 for non-concessional students and \$50.00 for concessional students.

This equates to \$6.66 per unit of competency for non-concessional student and \$3.33 for concessional students.

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
